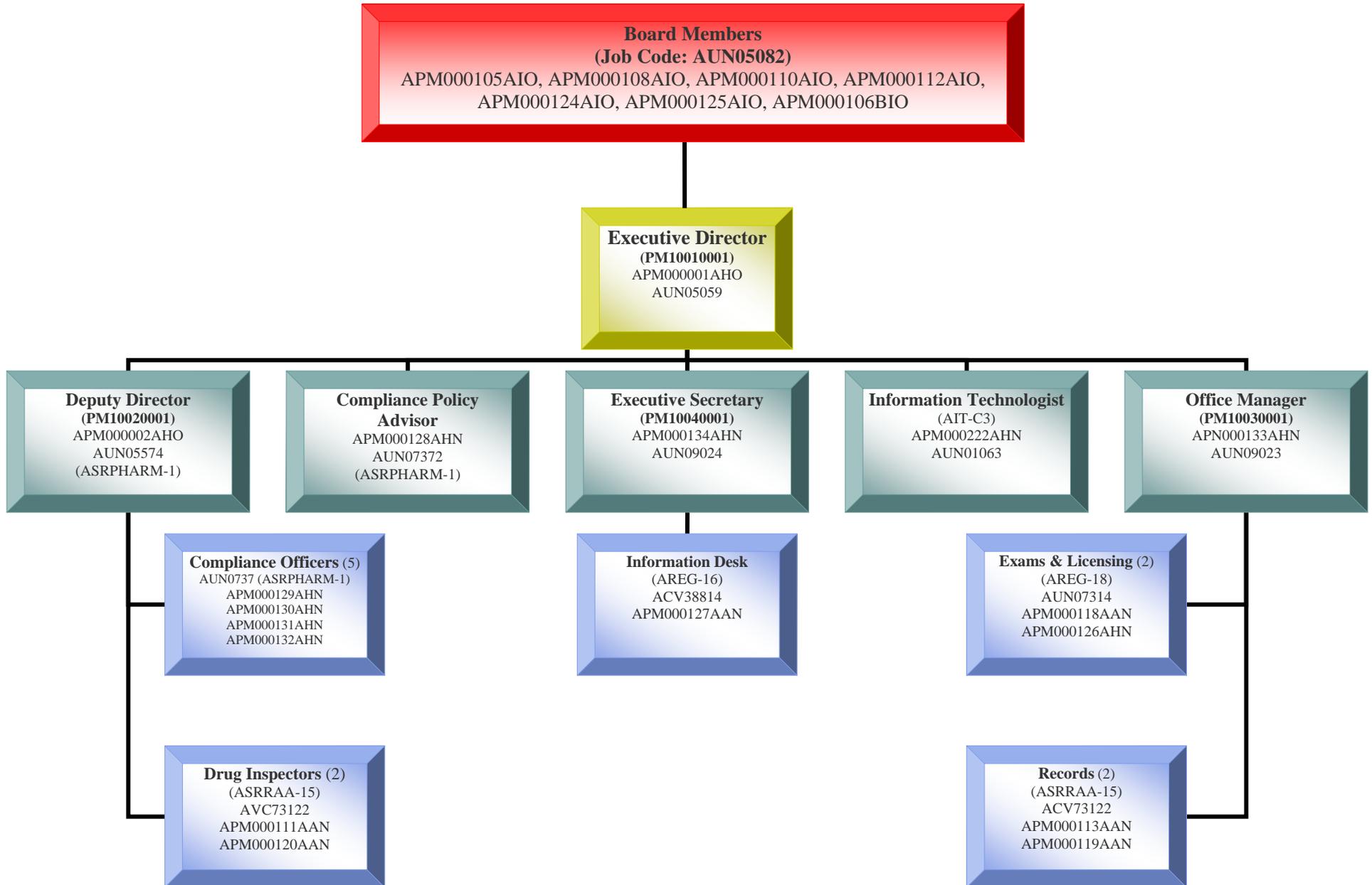

Dear Governor Brewer,

It is my pleasure to provide you and your office with the Board of Pharmacy 2009-2010 Annual Report. The report summarizes the activities of the Board for fiscal year 2010 and provides you with important statistical information. I believe that the Board has protected the public health and safety through its regulatory activities relating to the practice of pharmacy and the distribution of drugs. It has done so efficiently and within the budget appropriated by the legislature. Despite an increase in licensure and complaint related activities there was no increase in Board staff until the final week of the fiscal year. Due to the death of an employee we were approved to hire a replacement in order to continue our inspection activities as a critical part of accomplishing our mission.

The Board, in conjunction with the state pharmacy association and the state department of health services, was instrumental in helping the legislature draft and pass a statute allowing Arizona pharmacists who meet stringent certification requirements to administer most vaccines to patients without a prescription. This was critically important during the flu epidemic last year and helped to increase positive outcomes for those populations who were at the greatest risk. There are currently 1,641 pharmacist immunizers.

The Board also continued to fund and maintain the electronic controlled substance prescription monitoring program (PMP) authorized by the legislature in 2007. The PMP program monitors the activity of 22,400 prescribers as well as 4,931 dispensers of controlled substances in the state and has generated over 30,000 reports to prescribers, dispensers, patients, law enforcement agencies and professional boards. These activities are designed to prevent the unlawful diversion of prescription controlled substances which has been increasing at an alarming rate nationwide.
